Kia ora koutou Muritai whānau,

We've had some very cool and crisp mornings over the past couple of weeks but it has been great to have some still days and sunshine to enjoy the outdoors!

We could not have asked for better weather last Friday as we moved our termly Mihi Whakatau outdoors to welcome our new students, families and staff to the Muritai whānau. It was also a nice opportunity to gather together as a school in the afternoon to award our Principal Certificate recipients - the first time we have been able to do so all term due to the hall being out of action. We also had the Muritai Meerkats netball team take over the assembly to announce the winners of their raffle. - Izzy Longson Do Different Situations Affect Boys and Girls Differently Highly Commended (2-44)
- George Dent Forces on bridges Engineering New Zealand (1-31)
- Elodie Dent How drinkable is our water? Stantec New Zealand (2-42 and The Institute of Environmental Science (ESR) 2-42

To support us with this, please could you consider the items that your child has in their lunchboxes for morning tea and lunch.


