Kia ora koutou Muritai whānau,

Wow! It has been another busy fortnight at Muritai with so many exciting learning experiences happening both in and out of our kura!

As part of our Term 1 Inquiry - Safe in our Place, ākonga across the school have been exploring our local environment, learning about ecosystems, the tides and so much more. Kororā, Tūī and Kererū have been making the most of the fine weather and our new shared pathway to gain access to the rock pools at Windy Point. They have been discovering what creatures live in these spaces and the interactions they have with one another. Tūī and some of the Kererū classes also had the opportunity to get involved with the relocation of the native ngārara (lizards) that currently live at Windy Point, moving them to Camp Bay. What a special experience to be a part of - all the classes came back buzzing about their adventures!

Kororā have also been further afield this week, jumping on the bus to visit the Island Bay Marine Centre. This is another great hands-on experience where the children had the opportunity to explore the touch pool and get up close with the small marine creatures.

A huge thank you to our teachers for organising and providing all these exciting opportunities for our students. A massive shout out also to all the parents and caregivers who have helped out with supervision for these experiences - we simply can't do this without you!

Speaking of connecting with our environment, our Kāhu students are having a ball exploring the bush behind their classrooms during break times - turning the space into 'bush city' while also doing a great clean out of rubbish that has accumulated over many, many years!

We had a great day today at Huia Pool for our annual Year 4-8 Swimming Sports Competition. It was great to see great House spirit and fair play and healthy competition on display for the day.

Congratulations to all our students who won their races and/or achieved their personal best today - we are all very proud of you! Thanks to all the parents who came down to support our tamariki at the pool. A special thanks to Jon Mackie for organising the event for us this year.

With the swimming programme concluded, Year 3-8 classes are now in training for our annual Cross Country at the end of Term 1. We have brought this event forward this year so we have more of a buffer between our school event and Zone events at the start of Term 2. Keep a look out for additional information on this event in the next couple of weeks.

The Kererū teachers are in the final stages of prepping for our Year 5-6 Makahika Adventure in week 9. No doubt these families will be in preparation mode also, checking they have everything on the gear list and starting some pre packing. It is worth getting your child involved in this preparation as much as possible as they will be required to demonstrate a lot of self-management skills while they are away at Makahika.

This week we had a group of around 20 students participate at a Cricket Festival at Fraser Park. a relief teacher with your great students at
Muritai school. You may have seen me

30 years whilst raising four children. In
May/June this year my husband, daughter
and myself are heading to Zambia, to
voluntarily teach at a School in
Livingstone, Eliray Rose School for 2-12

year olds. This has been organised through an agency based here in NZ, IVHQ- International Volunteer Headquarters. It will be an incredible experience and a wonderful opportunity to give back.

My theme for relieving with my NZ students this term is learning about Africa and of course, Zambia. So far, the students have been very engaged and enthusiastic about my volunteering role and gaining more knowledge about Africa. I'm also keen to connect both schools. Eliray Rose Primary School is in desperate need of educational resources and are keen to create a library for their students. We will each take extra luggage, so we can bring over what we manage to collect for their classrooms. Muritai School library has already kindly donated some unused reading books.


