Kia ora koutou Muritai whānau,

And just like that, it is the end of an action-packed Term 1! Yesterday our Senior Leadership Team met together for the day to plan ahead into Term 2. We started the hui reflecting on the term that has been and celebrating the wonderful learning and events that have taken place in the first 11 weeks of the year - there was a long list to be proud of! One of the key highlights has been our Term 1 Inquiry - Safe in our Place, which has given all the classes the opportunities to connect their learning in the classroom to our local environment. Exploring our beach and bush puts the learning into an authentic context for our ākonga and helps them make connections with the wider world around them. In addition to this we have had a busy event schedule which included our Days Bay Picnic, swimming at Eastbourne Pool (including swimming sports), Makahika camp for Kererū, our first Mihi Whakatau for 2024 to name just a few.

Speaking of events, we also hosted our Year 3-8 Cross Country at Eastbourne Rec this week. This was an optional event and it was impressive to see the high participation levels across all year levels. Congratulations to everyone that participated, in particular our top runners that qualified for the Zone Cross Country events next term. Check out the results further down the newsletter. It was wonderful to see all of our 'BEST' values on display, a healthy sense of competition and a marvellous House spirit! A big thank you to Jamie Power and the $Tu\bar{\iota}$ teaching team who organised this event for us all.

We are all adjusting to having our Kāhu team join the main campus over the past week. Ka pai to all the Kāhu students and teachers for your hard mahi in making the move across the road, this included all your furniture, equipment and learning resources too! It has made our playground during break times much busier but we have been super impressed with the way our senior students are continuing to show outstanding leadership and are sound role models for their younger peers.

With our 3 Kāhu classes on the main site and Room 3 opening for our next roll growth class next term, we will be at full capacity for the next wee while. The timeline for the Senior School building project is likely to take at least all of Term 2 so we will be nice and cosy together as we move into the winter months. This project is to address weathertightness remediation which is long overdue. The final result may not look too dissimilar to what we have now but it will make the buildings a healthier, more comfortable place to work and learn in. While the building work takes place, our Senior School site will be off limits. This is due to health and safety so please respect the fenced off areas of this part of the school while construction takes place.



Speaking of property, the interior of our hall project is finally completed! We are just awaiting the final stage of the exterior cladding to be completed and the final sign off from the Council. This has been a VERY drawn-out process to get to the finish line so I thank you for your patience as we get the final boxes ticked. All going to plan these new bathrooms and kitchen will be available to use from the start of Term 2.
