Kia ora koutou Muritai whānau,

Welcome to Term 3! It's hard to believe we are halfway through 2023! I hope you all enjoyed the school break - it was lovely to have this continued settled weather in Te Whanganui-a-Tara!

It is great to see all the Muritai children back to start the new term. We have 9 new entrant students joining us, along with another 4 students joining us in other classrooms across the school. A total of 402 students currently in the Muritai whanāu!

We also welcome a couple of new staff to our team. Sally Ingram and Kristi Field are our new Room 3 teachers and Nicola Tod has joined our Teacher Aide team. It is great to have you all with us!

We have another exciting term of learning planned ahead. Look out for syndicate newsletters that will give you more detail on the learning programmes happening in each team.

We also have some exciting property developments happening this term. All going to plan, our long awaited hall refurbishment project will get underway at the beginning of August. This will mean we will have limited access to the hall for the majority of Term 3 and into Term 4, which will have implications for some of our normal processes. Primarily, We will be unable to host whole school assemblies in Term 3 and Kelly Club will be relocated to another space. We will continue to give fortnightly Principal Awards but this will be presented in another setting. I'll keep you posted with developments as the term progresses.


### Learning Conversations - Week 3.

On August 1st and 3rd, we will be hosting Learning Conversations for parents and caregivers. This is an opportunity for you to book a time with your child's classroom teacher so they can share more about their progress and achievement over the first half of the year.

I encourage you to bring along your child's recent academic report with you to these hui.

To avoid two late nights at school for our teachers and to ensure we make time for everyone, we are starting these sessions at the earlier time of 2:15pm. If you are able to, we would really appreciate it if your child/ren could be collected from school at the earlier time of 2pm, so teachers are available to meet with parents who have booked earlier times. We will still be providing supervision for children who are unable to be collected for the last hour of each day.

To book a time with your child's teacher, you will need to use the 'Parent Interview' function on our new caregiver app. You will receive a notification on your app shortly. Click on the interview icon and follow the instructions to book your times. Please note that Room 7 children and most of Room 1 will not have interviews due to the length of time they have been at school.

This money has allowed us to employ additional teachers, thus keeping our class sizes small across the school - most under 25 students. Without this contribution, many classes will have over 30 students. We know this is so appreciated by students, staff and you at home!

Secondly, thank you for paying your child's activity fee. This fee goes towards additional opportunities we offer for our learners. An example of this is our Shuttletime programme that is happening currently. All classrooms are learning badminton skills by an external instructor over the next two weeks. Such fun!
