- **Email:** We regularly utilise email for reminders and other important messages. Please contact the school office if your email address needs updating from last year.

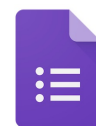

Muritai is a SunSmart school. This term it is compulsory for all children to wear hats when outside at playtimes, lunch or undertaking sport. You may also like to apply sunblock to your children before school. Children also need to wear shoes at school to protect their feet, and clothes that are suitable for sun protection and sports activities.
