Kia ora Muritai whānau,

Hasn't it been wonderful to see the sun over the past week or so! The still, crisp autumn days are always welcomed in Eastbourne and Muritai.

I'm pleased to report that our school hall is back up and running again after the recent completion of work on the adjoining storage rooms and entrance by the PE shed. This of course means we are able to utilise this large space for Kapa Haka and gather the whole school together for assemblies.

At the beginning of this week we hosted an impromptu assembly on Monday morning. This was a great opportunity to do a little 'reset' with our school culture and a reminder of the importance of demonstrating our Living Values in all areas. This term we are really focusing on the importance of 'Togetherness' so we can all function well as a team of learners. At our school, **Togetherness** is more than just sharing a space—it is the heartbeat of our community. It links nicely to the Māori concept of **whakawhanaungatanga**.

Whakawhanaungatanga is the intentional action of building deep, meaningful connections. It is about recognizing that we aren't just individuals co-existing; we are an extended family (*whānau*).

When we practice whakawhanaungatanga, we make a conscious effort to understand one another, celebrate our diverse backgrounds, and lift each other up. It transforms our school from a place of learning into a place of true belonging.

How do we build this extended family? It starts with the everyday choices we make in how we treat one another. Manners, politeness, and everyday courtesy are the foundation of whakawhanaungatanga.

When we say "please" and "thank you," hold a door open, or greet someone with a warm smile, we are doing much more than just being polite. We are sending a clear message: *I see you, I respect you, and you matter to this family.* Good manners are the acts of kindness that build trust, break down walls, and make our school a safe, welcoming place for everyone.

Our staff will be looking out for this awesome behaviour and attitude throughout the rest of this term so we can celebrate the great things that are happening in our kura!



Zone Cross Country

It was a stellar day in Petone on Tuesday for the Zone Cross Country Event at Sladden Park. This year we had close to 50 Year 3-6 students represent us at this event and we achieved some great results! 20 of these students have qualified for the next round, meaning they will be joining our Year 7 and 8 qualifiers at the Interzone event later in the term. Congratulations and thank you to everyone who represented us on the day!

BLAKE NZ VR Experience

Last week Kahu students had the exciting opportunity to experience the BLAKE NZ-VR programme, inspired by the legacy of Sir Peter Blake. Through immersive virtual reality headsets, students explored important topics including climate change, renewable energy, sustainable transport, agriculture and ways to reduce our reliance on fossil fuels. The engaging session brought Aotearoa's marine and coastal environments to life, allowing students to see both the challenges facing our planet and the innovative solutions being developed across New Zealand and the Pacific.

Students learnt about kaitiakitanga and practical actions they can take to help protect our environment, from using sustainable transport and clean energy to caring for our oceans and marine life. The experience was both inspiring and thought-provoking, encouraging students to consider how they can make a positive difference to the future of our planet.

Also last week there was a powerful sea of colour, with students and staff celebrating Pink Shirt Day. This global movement is more than just a dress-up day; it is a firm commitment to speaking up and standing together against bullying. By wearing pink, our rangatahi (youth) are promoting a culture of kindness, inclusion, and diversity, reminding us all that Muritai and Eastbourne is a place where everyone should feel safe, valued, and respected. This year we raised approximately \$430 for the Mental Health Foundation - thank you Muritai whānau!

Reporting to Parents

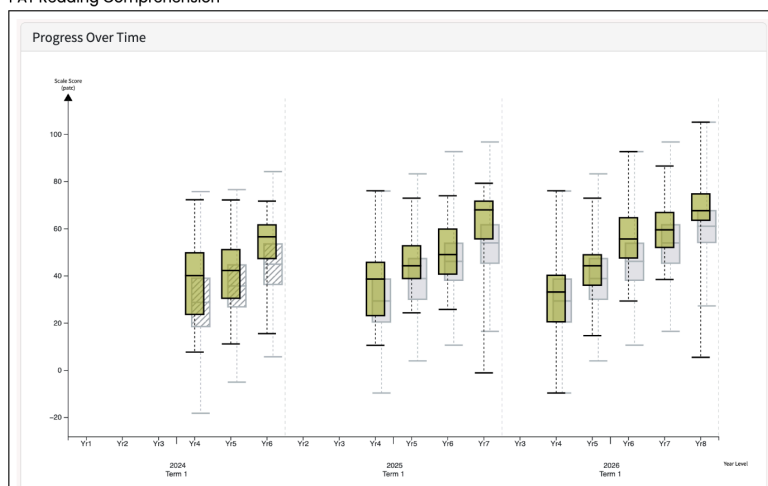

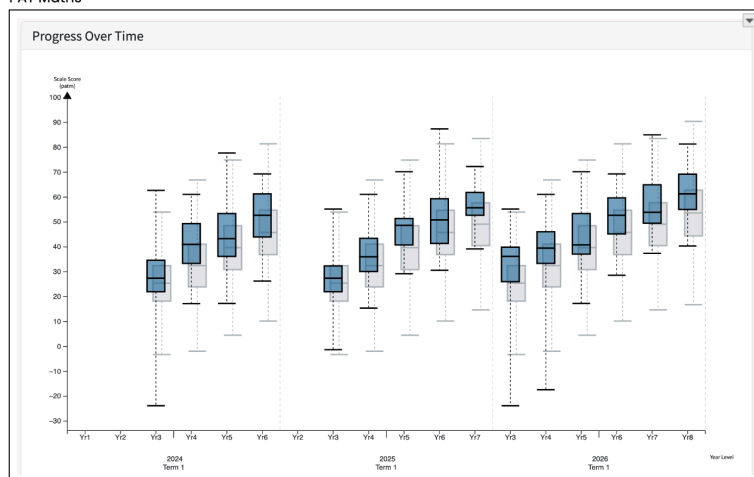
Student Achievement

At our last Board of Trustees meeting, Ginny Treadwell attended and presented our first student achievement report for 2026. This report was focused on the achievement scores from recent PAT testing for Year 3-8 students. Our Board was thrilled with the results that were shared, showing all year groups are achieving above national norms. Below is a snapshot of some of the results:
