# **Communication**

At Muritai we use a variety of platforms to communicate important information between school and home. We believe in keeping you updated with up and coming events along with celebrating our successes. School is a busy place and we also understand the life of the parent is also a busy one so we are continuing to look at ways to streamline our communications. Below is a breakdown of our key ways of communicating between home and school:

• **The Muritai Beacon:** This newsletter will be distributed fortnightly on a Friday afternoon. As we are an Enviro-School we distribute this via the parent app. We are happy to include community messages in the newsletter. We would appreciate it if all messages could be shared with the school office by the Wednesday afternoon before the Beacon is distributed.



- **Weekly Heads-up:** On Friday afternoons every week you'll receive a short email bullet pointing important 'need to knows' from across the school. This is a great way to keep up to date with the next week's activities.
- The @School App Parent App. We introduced this app last year and we are intending to add more functionality to this in 2024. We will use the app for most of our communications, sending out notices, our newsletter, distributing student reports on your child and celebrating the learning. There are also useful links to the



school facebook page and calendar. If you have not already logged in, please refer to the email that was shared last week or send an email to the office (office@muritai.school.nz) and Carole or Jo will send you through login details. To make this work for you at home, we recommend allowing notifications on this app so we get alerted when new information is available.

• **Email:** We regularly utilise email for reminders and other important messages. Please contact the school office if your email address needs updating from last year.

# The term ahead

In the next couple of weeks, you will receive a syndicate leader newsletter from your child's Team Leader which will give you a run down of specific systems that may be unique to their team along with a breakdown of what the learning focus will look like for the term ahead. Below are a couple of key elements to our Term 1 programme that are important to note:

- The first few weeks of the year is 'Get Set, Go!' This time is dedicated to reviewing our school's Learning and Living Values and for the classes to establish their ways of working to ensure they are set for success for the year ahead. This is a wonderful opportunity to reinforce expectations and grow relationships between classmates and teachers.
- **SCHOOL PICNIC!** On Friday 9th of February we are all heading to Days Bay for a whole school picnic! We will be exploring the beach, bush and Williams Park. In order to make this happen, we will require plenty of parent volunteers to help with supervision and our activities. Please keep an eye out in your inbox today for additional information on this special day. Everyone is welcome to join us as it will be a wonderful opportunity to connect.
- Our Swimming programme commences at Eastbourne Pool from Week 3. Please ensure you
  are aware of what day your child's class is swimming so they come prepared for their
  sessions. How lucky are we to have this community resource on our doorstep to utilise!
- Our **Learning Partnership meetings** will be held on February 13th and 15th. This will be an opportunity for you to make a time with your child's classroom teacher and share key information about your child. This is always an incredibly useful process for our teachers. Keep a look out for booking information, using the caregiver app, at the beginning of next week.
- Our Kererū Syndicate will be finishing the term with their annual trip to Camp Makahika from 26-28 March. Again, there will be loads of additional communications that will come your way as your child prepares for this experience, including a parent information session held at school.

## **Sun Smart**

Muritai is a SunSmart school. This term it is compulsory for all children to wear hats when outside at playtimes, lunch or undertaking sport. Please ensure your children have their named sun hats at school every day to enable them to play outside freely. Children without sun hats will be restricted to the shade sail area. You may also like to apply sunblock to your children before school. Children also need to wear shoes at school to protect their feet, and clothes that are suitable for sun protection and sports activities.

### **Property**

2024 will be another big year with property developments. Below is an update on what is currently happening and what we have to look forward to over the next 12 months:

- **Hall Project:** We are reaching the final stages of this project and we are all looking forward to having our new kitchen and bathroom facilities available to us in the next couple of weeks! There will be further work to complete on the external cladding.
- **Painting:** The buildings around the Junior Courtyard received a fresh lick of paint over the summer break. Rooms 4, 5 and 6 and the admin blocks are looking very smart.
- **Heat Pumps for Tūī:** Our classrooms upstairs have welcomed the new additions to their spaces with new heat pumps to keep them cool in the summer and warm in the winter. They were put to good use on day 1 of the term!
- Weathertightness work for Kāhu site: We have received confirmation from the Ministry of Education that much needed remedial work for our senior school will be taking place in the first half of 2024. This is a significant project and will require us to relocate our Kāhu classes onto the main site while construction work is carried out. Having this work happen at the beginning of the year works best for us as we will have classroom space available before roll growth classes start later in the school year. It does mean we will be at full capacity though without the luxury of additional 'break-out' spaces to work in. We will keep you posted with developments when we get a clearer idea of potential start dates.

# Speak Again and Drum lessons at Muritai

As you are aware, our Muritai tamariki are fortunate to have the opportunity to tap into private music and drama lessons during class time. Due to the upcoming construction work happening in Kāhu our additional teaching spaces are going to be very limited which means we need to prioritise spaces for teachers and classes. As a consequence, we are unable to host drum lessons and Speak Again lessons during class time. We really value these opportunities so we hope to be able to provide these again once construction work concludes. # **Creatives in Schools Project**

Kia ora. My name is Prue Langbein and I'm excited to be at Muritai School this first term as part of a Creatives in Schools project Taringa Talk, a sound based project to encourage, develop and extend the listening and oral communication skills of our tamariki.

I worked at Radio NZ for many years as a producer for drama, story and book readings and children's programmes and since then have focussed on working with children and young people, something I really enjoy.

Children today are bombarded with visual stimuli and screen culture. Taringa Talk provides a break from this and enables tamariki to discover the imaginative freedom and fun the world of sound provides. Listening also helps us develop empathy and understanding.

As well as listening, children will be encouraged to explore their own voices and share their stories and sounds. This can build confidence, relationships and language skills. We'll do some audio recording so children can enjoy hearing themselves and their classmates.

At the end of the project we'll have a celebration which families will be welcome to attend. Throughout the project we encourage whānau to engage in listening and conversations with their children. There'll be opportunities for recording at home which you can help with, and we plan to share some of the classroom mahi with you as the term progresses.

I'll be working with Nicolette Fisher and her class as well as Sheldon Wilson and Carmen McDonald. I'll also involve the senior classes towards the end of the project to share ideas about audio. I'm very much looking forward to being with your children at Muritai School.
