# **Property Update**

Work is progressing well on our school hall and we are on track for the contractors to be returning the hall interior for us to use by the end of November. This is perfect timing as our hall is a critical part of our end of year celebrations.

The next stage of this roofing project will commence at the beginning of December and involves roof and window replacements across Rooms 4, 5 and 6. This will require these classes to relocate for the final 2 weeks of the school year. It is not ideal but by starting this stage early we can guarantee these classroom spaces will be available to us at the start of 2026. Thankfully, we have spare classrooms available for these classes to work in:

Room 4 will move to Room 7

Room 5 will move to the STEM Room (Green room by the field)

Room 6 will move to Room 14 upstairs.

For the students and families in Rooms 4, 5 and 6, we will keep you posted with updates on this move, closer to the time.

During the summer holiday, work will also move onto the two story block. This is likely to extend through to the end of Term 1, 2026 and will impact on our use of some of the upstairs classrooms. Again, I will keep you informed regarding classroom relocation closer to the end of the year.

## Staffing update

Last week we successfully appointed a new teacher for Kāhu. Next year we welcome Logan Managh to Muritai School who has had several years experience in the Year 7 and 8 area, working at Brandan Intermediate and most recently working as a PE specialist teacher in Sydney. His passions are Maths and Te Reo Māori. We are very excited to have Logan join the Kāhu team.

## **Our Commitment to Te Tiriti**

Earlier this week legislation was passed that removed the obligation for school boards to uphold Te Tiriti o Waitangi. Our School Board will be writing a letter to the Ministry, and Minister of Education Erica Standford to state our disagreement with this direction.

Our commitment remains strong. As a crown entity, we have a legal and moral duty to give effect to Te Tiriti. Embedding Te Tiriti principles leads to improved engagement, achievement and well being for all students, especially Māori.

At Muritai School we have worked incredibly hard over the past 3 years to ensure these principles are visible at our kura. I am proud of how far we have come and acknowledge there is further work to be done in this space.
