Kia ora koutou Muritai whānau,

Wow! The term is racing by. It's hard to believe we are halfway through Term 3 already. The colder weather recently has seen a large volume of absence across the school over the last couple of weeks. It sounds like there are a lot of nasty bugs and viruses floating around at present. Many thanks for keeping your tamariki at home if they are unwell.

No doubt you would have heard the news this week that the Government has now lifted all of the remaining Covid restrictions for the country which means the 7 day isolation period has now been lifted. Of course the advice still remains that if your child is unwell they should stay at home to stop the spread of any bug. Ministry of Health guidelines still recommend you isolate for at least 5 days if you test positive for Covid-19.

It has been great to see our senior students out and about recently, making use of the great opportunities the capital city offers. All the classes in Kererū enjoyed visiting the Dowse Art Gallery in Lower Hutt last week where they were taken through the "Unhinged" exhibition followed by a workshop where they made a personal taonga, inspired by what they enjoy and the people and places that are important to them. The Kahū team visited Parliament last week as part of their 'I AM' unit which feeds in nicely to thinking about young people's place in society and how we all engage with services within the community.

Last week a large group of students from Kererū headed to Days Bay to take part in a sporting exchange with Wellesley College. Hockey, Football and Rugby were all on offer and it was wonderful to hear about the great sportsmanship on display across all the sports. It was also a treat visiting the classes in Tūī this week. On Tuesday they held a special 'Makers Day' with a whole lot of creativity on display. After making detailed plans, ākonga then created dream houses, marble runs and scenes made from lego and cardboard. Many then made stop motion animation using their creations. What a magic day for our young learners!

Well done to everyone who participated in our Pyjama Day last Friday - it certainly was a great day for keeping warm in cosy night attire! Thank you to everyone who brought along a gold coin to donate to Ronald McDonald House - a total of \$352.90 raised altogether!
